RETROMOBILE 2024 BY ARTCURIAL MOTORCARS

Auctions on February 2nd and 3rd, 2024 Salon Rétromobile - Paris Expo - Hall 2.2 Porte de Versailles - Paris 15

On the upcoming 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} of February, during the Rétromobile Show in Paris, Artcurial Motorcars will showcase the most anticipated Collector Car auction of the year. On Friday, February 2^{nd} , 131 cars will be presented in a warm atmosphere, and the following day, the 3^{rd} , 21 motorcycles will be auctioned just before the traditional Automobilia sale.

Paris – From January 31st to February 4th, 2024, the 48th edition of the Rétromobile Show will take place in Paris, one of the world's largest exhibitions dedicated to Vintage Cars, their accessories, and now, motorcycles. For the thirteenth consecutive year, over two full days of spectacular auctions orchestrated by the Artcurial Motorcars team, visitors will have the opportunity to explore a selection of automobiles, each with illustrious histories and prestigious pedigrees. Notably, no fewer than 25 collections will be dispersed during this sale!

- 14 exceptional pre-war cars, including 5 Bugatti models.
- 8 Citroën cars, including one of the fifteen 1970 Citroën DS21 ie Cabriolets.
- 15 Ferraris, featuring the one of the top lot, a Ferrari 250 GT California Spyder LWB, a Ferrari 250 GT Lusso, and a Ferrari 275 GTB that participated in the 1966 Rallye du Var.
- 13 Porsches, including the Porsche 911 S sold new to Jean-Claude Killy in 1968, the same year as his triple Olympic triumph.

- 10 Lamborghinis, with a Countach and a Lamborghini Collection presented without reserve, including a 350 GT, a 400 GT, and a Lamborghini 400 GT Spyder conversion.
- To celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Mercedes 300 SL Papillon, Artcurial Motorcars will present one equipped with the rare original Rudge wheels and a 300 SL Roadster with its original hardtop and disc brakes.
- Luxury will be showcased with a set of Rolls-Royce cars, along with an exceptional Bentley Cabriolet commissioned by the King of Denmark.
- The lineup includes 3 McLaren supercars: a Pl, a Senna, and an impressive Speedtail with central driving.
- Original-condition cars and barn finds such as a De Dion Bouton Tricycle and a Citroën 2CV Sahara, presented without reserve.
- 50 automobiles in this sale are presented without reserve.

Finally, the motorcycle auction will resonate with the 2000m2 vintage motorcycle area, a significant novelty for the 2024 edition, located adjacent to the Artcurial exhibition space in Hall 2 »

- Lamborghini Siàn, part of the 63 units produced as a nod to the brand's birth year in 1963. A technological masterpiece, the Siàn adds extreme performance to its rarity, exclusivity, and striking design. The offered specimen is also in a condition close to new. (Est. €240,000-€280,000).
- 2014 McLaren Pl, with only 9,354 km on the odometer and 375 units built, the Pl is the rarest hypercar of its generation. (Est. €1,200,000-€1,500,000).
- For the first time in a European auction, a Porsche 964 from the renowned American tuner Singer equipped with a 4L, 400hp engine! It is in a new condition with only 1,000 km since leaving the Singer workshops. (Est. €900,000-€1,200,000).
- A World Champion, the 1975 Alfa Romeo Tipo 33 TTTI2 will be the highlight of the auction, representing the ultimate evolution of the Alfa

- 33 that won the Championship in 1975. This particular model boasts two victories in Interseries, with drivers D. Bell and J. Mass, adding a unique historical dimension to this collectible piece. Its history is meticulously tracked, with a recent body restoration illustrating the commitment to preserving its authenticity. The engine of this Alfa Romeo is truly one of a kind, with a particularly melodic sound, reminiscent of the Golden Age of prototypes. (Est. €1,200,000-€1,600,000).
- Exceptional Citroën DS3, the first chassis of the DS3 WRC produced by Citroën. It represents a crucial milestone in the genesis of this future rally queen, which would become a double world champion. Used by factory drivers Bugalsky, Sordo, Loeb, Ogier, Meeke during numerous test sessions and participated in the 2017 Rallye de Monte-Carlo. (Est. €350,000-€450,000).
